TIMELINE OF THE SENATE'S 4 ATTEMPTS TO REDUCE ACCESS TO QUALITY HEALTHCARE

JUNE 26, 2017

Better Care Reconciliation Act of 2017 (BCRA)

IMPACTS

- **22 million** uninsured by 2026
- **\$772 billion** cut from Medicaid
- Elimination of **\$1 billion** Prevention and Public Health Fund
- Reduced eligibility for premium subsidies and greater burden for older, low-income Americans
- Process lacked transparency and nurse input

JULY 13 & JULY 20, 2017

Better Care Reconciliation Act of 2017 (BCRA) Amended

IMPACTS

- **22 million** uninsured by 2026
- **\$756 billion** cut from Medicaid
- Work requirements for certain individuals to receive Medicaid
- Allowed the sale of "skeleton" plans that eliminated coverage of essential health benefits (removed in July 20 version)
- Elimination of **\$1 billion** Prevention and Public Health Fund
- Process lacked transparency and nurse input

JULY 2017

Obamacare Repeal Reconciliation Act of 2017 (Originally drafted and passed by the Senate in 2015 to be vetoed by President Obama)

IMPACTS

- **32 million** uninsured by 2026
- **\$842 billion** cut from Medicaid
- 3/4 of the population would live in areas with no insurer participation for the non-group market
- The average premium would **increase by over 50%**
- Elimination of **\$1 billion** Prevention and Public Health Fund
- Process lacked transparency and nurse input
